## 1. What is this product?

Term	The product has a fixed term and will be due on 3 August 2026, subject to an early redemption.
Objectives	<p>The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) conditional interest payments and (2) a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of these payments will depend on the performance of the <b>underlyings</b>. If, at maturity, the <b>final reference level</b> of the <b>worst performing underlying</b> has fallen below its <b>barrier level</b>, the product may return less than the <b>product notional amount</b> or even zero.</p> <p><b>Early termination following an autocall:</b> The product will terminate prior to the <b>maturity date</b> if, on any <b>autocall observation date</b>, the <b>reference level</b> of the <b>worst performing underlying</b> is at or above its <b>autocall barrier level</b>. 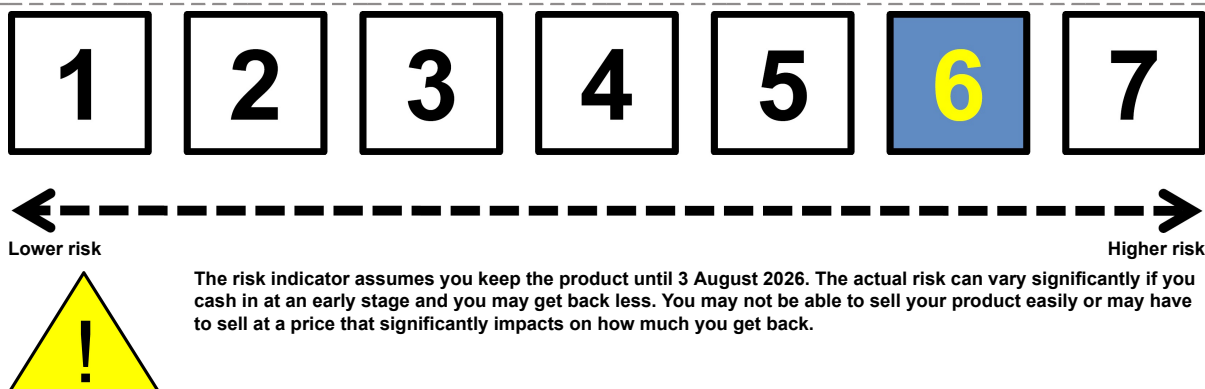

## 2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

### Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 6 out of 7, which is the second-highest risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a high level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

The favourable, moderate and unfavourable scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the reference assets' performance over up to 5 past years. In the case of an early redemption, it has been assumed that no reinvestment has occurred. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances. ### 3. What happens if the manufacturer is unable to pay out?

### 5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

#### Recommended holding period: 3 years and 3 months

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 3 August 2026 (maturity).

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. No fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.
